Class Assignments

- All work must be received by the set deadlines for full credit. No late work will be accepted.
- On-time projects may be redone with instructor approval.
- Midterm and final quizzes cannot be made up and must be completed on the assigned day.
- All submitted work must be from the current quarter, unless specific permission is granted.

Professional Presentation

- All projects must be printed on high quality paper and mounted in a clean and professional way. *The school print shop requires 24 hour notice. Lateness due to unfinished printing is the student's responsibility and the project is considered incomplete.*
- All essays must be printed and stapled prior to the class period for full credit.
- All assignments must be ready for critique at the BEGINNING of the class period for full credit.

Plagiarism/ Academic Dishonesty

- Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of academic honesty. Plagiarism is a serious violation of the Student Code of Conduct.
- Plagiarism is the use of another person's ideas, words or visual images presented in a manner that makes the work appear to be the student's original creation.
- Plagiarism of text or images, even if unintentional, results in a failure of the assignment.
