

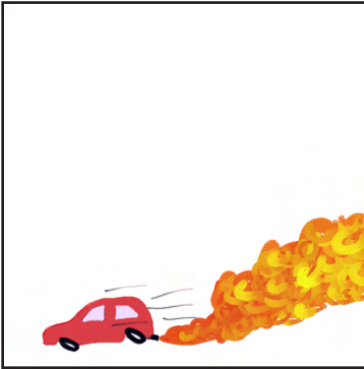


## **Process File**

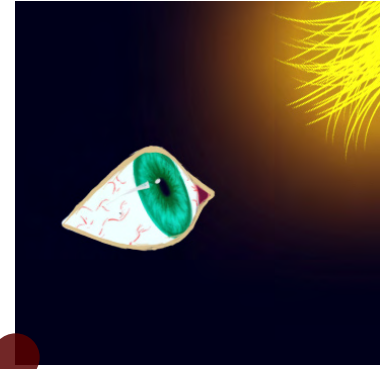
